Rules for Animal Safety

- Leave unknown dogs alone.
- Stand still (never run) and BE A TREE.
- Don't look the dog directly in the eye.
- If already lying down or knocked down by a dog 'ACT LIKE A LOG'.
- Never bother a dog when it is eating.
- Never enter a dogs territory (his yard, home, car) if he growls at you. Back up slowly.

can he be?

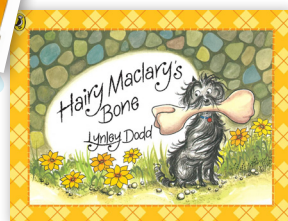

WHAT DO DOGS NEED?

- To be properly trained.
- Somewhere warm and cosy to sleep.
- A bed or kennel with a blanket.
- Regular walks and a lead for walking.
- Worming and regular flea treatments.
- Company - dogs need to be with other dogs or people a lot.
- A good diet and fresh, clean water to drink.
- To be brushed everyday, especially if they have long hair.
- Help clean their teeth. Have special toothpaste; get their teeth regularly checked by a Vet.
- Someone to clean up with a pooper scooper.
- To be taken to the vet when injured or ill.
- To be looked after when owners are away on holiday.
- Well fenced garden to play and exercise in.
- Never to be left in a car in WARM weather.



BALL DOG

- Craft felt
- Pom-pom
- Googly eyes
- Ribbon
- Scissors
- Craft Glue or Hot Glue
- 7 styrofoam balls or plastic golf balls



Glue four of the balls together to form a square (these are the legs). Also glue two golf balls together (the body).

Let these all dry. Lay the group of four balls down then glue the set of two on top. Glue the final golf ball on top of one of the body. Set aside to dry. Cut two ears, a small nose and a tail out of the felt. Glue them in place. Glue on a set of googly eyes and also a pom-pom snout and nose. As a finishing touch glue a piece of ribbon around the dog's neck for a collar!
